

Item	Questions and Answers	
2.1	 Q. Our firm has extensive qualifications supporting Maryland Counties with past work (2023) in Queen Anne's County and a current project in Cecil County. We also have a staff member who lives in Cambridge, Maryland. The RFP states that residence of the firm/consultant is ideally from Worcester County. Are out-of-state firms eligible to support your County given extensive child and adolescent behavioral health experience and client history in Maryland? A. RFPs from firms outside the state will be eligible to apply for the RFP. The chosen firm/vendor will demonstrate extensive knowledge of the unique landscape of Worcester, including but not limited to demographics, poverty, employment and other social determinants of health that impact overall wellbeing. 	
2.2	 Q. The timeline stated is from July 1 to October 31st. Are there any details of milestones within this fourmonth project tenure? (draft report, presentation to County Behavioral Health Authority, etc.) A. The LBHA reserves the right to negotiate with the chosen firm/vendor about the timeline of the project including the possibility of presentation to specific Boards and Committees. The Needs Assessment is expected to include at minimum a detailed description of the work completed, analysis of the data, summary of findings, recommendations for future programming, and a presentation of work, data, findings and recommendations to the Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority. 	
2.3	Q. For the quantitative data (surveys) are participant incentives permitted in the budget?A. Incentives, such as gift cards, are not an eligible purchase with the funding. However, funds may be used to offset costs associated with food for meetings, supplies and other essentials.	

2.4	Q. Should application materials such as the narrative, technical information and budget be submitted
	together or in separate sealed envelopes?
	A. Applicants can include all application materials (e.g. narrative and budget) in one sealed envelope.
2.5	Q. Will venues for activities such as town halls be provided?
	A. Applicants will be responsible for securing venues for their activities, but the Worcester County Local
	Behavioral Health Authority can supply recommendations and options upon request.
	Q. The RFP has asked for the collection of information related to children, youth and parents, focusing on issues including behavioral and mental health and juvenile legal issues. Requested collection methods include town hall meetings and community interviews. Because of the discussion around sensitive
	issues and youth, should we address IRB approval of the collection methods in our proposal, and would the requested timeline allow for extension if the approval process is longer than originally proposed? Is there an expectation of any direct collection from individuals under the age of 18?
2.6	A. The selected vendor will be responsible for applying for IRB approval if applicable. For collection methods requiring IRB approval, applicants should address IRB approval in the proposal. The requested timeline can be adjusted, if needed, to allow for IRB approval. It is expected that the selected applicant will prioritize this process in an attempt to operate within the timeline, or as close as possible. There is no specific expectation of direct collection from individuals under the age of 18. However, applicants are encouraged to consider data collection and data sources that will support completion of the highest quality Needs Assessment.

Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority (WCLBHA) Overview

The Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority (WCLBHA) role is to provide oversight, support, resources, and management of behavioral health services funded by the public behavioral health sector.

(Title 10- Section 1201-3 of the Annotated Code of Maryland)

Request for Proposals (RFP) Overview

- The Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority is seeking proposals from qualified individuals/entities to perform a Needs Assessment that captures needs, gaps, and services within the Worcester County community, specifically for children, youth, and their families.
- The funding for this Needs Assessment comes from the Behavioral Health Administration, and is contracted through the Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority (WCLBHA).

Award Specifications

- This award will fund projects up to \$48,204 (to include indirect costs, administrative fees, and incentives).
- The award will be for the time frame of July 1, 2024 Oct. 31, 2024. If you do
 not believe the desired timeline listed is feasible, propose a modified timeline
 with justification for changes.

Objective Overview

- The WCLBHA is seeking proposals from qualified individuals/entities to determine needs, gaps and resources for Worcester County's children, youth, and their families through completion of a Needs Assessment.
- The ultimate goal of this Needs Assessment is to determine what type of program would best meet the needs of youth/families in Worcester County in the future (with a program budget of roughly \$40,000-\$50,000).
- This Needs Assessment should capture not only the overarching themes within the county through quantitative data analysis, but also needs through qualitative data.

Data Sources

- The WCLBHA believes that it is important to utilize existing quantitative data sources both at the local, state and federal level in order to produce an informed assessment of the community.
- Additionally, the chosen individual/entity will be required to collect a variety of qualitative data from sources which could include hosting town hall meetings, conducting community interviews, and hosting meetings for government/community agencies to produce a comprehensive assessment.

Target Population & Focus of Needs Assessment

The Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority wants to better understand the challenges that face children, youth and parent(s)/guardian(s) when it comes to accessing services and resources, including but not limited to the following:

- Behavioral Health Services
- Medical Health Services
- After School Resources
- Childcare Resources
- Early Intervention Services (birth to 5 years old)
- Stable Access to Food
- Stable Access to Housing
- Job Development/Consistent Employment
- Risk Factors for Juvenile Legal Issues

Relevant Data & Data Sources - Worcester County Community Health Data

- The <u>Worcester County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHA)</u> highlights quantitative and qualitative data related to health in Worcester County.

SDAT GOOD STANDING REQUIREMENT: Individual/entity conducting business with the Worcester County Local Behavioral Health Authority will need to be registered with the <u>Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT</u>), and be in good standing.

- The cover page should be a stand-alone page and each bulleted item below should be a denoted heading within the proposal, with sub-headings used as appropriate.

 - Organizational Chart
 - Proposed Approach
 - Budget
 - References & Work Samples/Case Studies

The proposal should be a clear, concise narrative organized by and responsive to the below sections and criteria.
